LoopFinder (Free)

Find out where looped venues are, connect with hearing health care professionals, suggest places to be looped

Spatial Release (Free)

App that looks at a person's ability to hear in the presence of noise. You can measure auditory thresholds in quiet vs. noise to see how noise affects your hearing ability.
